At the secondary level, the collection of supplementary materials shall be in accordance with the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o a live, up-to-date, growing collection to meet the changing needs of the faculty and students</li> <li>o up-to-date (published the last 5 years) encyclopedias; dictionaries of people, of places, of events; almanacs; indexes; statistics are required</li> <li>o the magazine collection be sufficient to meet the needs for current news, comments; special features of interest; and recreational (should include 25% of total collection)</li> <li>o daily newspaper coverage of local, state, national and international happenings be supplied in sufficient quantity to provide for the needs of the enrollment;</li> <li>o collection of professional books and periodicals in line with curriculum needs and interests should be provided for teachers and administrators;</li> <li>o a functional pamphlet and clipping file that is timely should be available to supplement all other materials; and</li> <li>o an annual expenditure of \$300 is recommended for these materials.</li> </ul> <p>(Standards for School Libraries in the State of Rhode Island).</p>	<p>The school library houses a collection of supplementary materials as described in the library standards.</p> <p>10000</p> <p>encyclopedias          new ref          periodicals          microform          etc etc          professional          journals</p>
